Our guest speaker is anti-trafficking advocate, Jasmine Marino. In her true story, *The Diary of Jasmine Grace: Trafficked. Recovered. Redeemed.*, this modern-day abolitionist reflects on the values and experiences that influenced her. Sharing her diary, she will talk about how she landed in a 12-step program, a job in the anti-trafficking movement and a place in a community church. She has spoken on panels at the U.S Commission on Civil Rights in New Hampshire and at two side panels for members of the United Nations in New York. Jasmine consults with healthcare professionals, law enforcement personnel, educators and nonprofit organizations and advises on issues such as safe homes, program growth, curriculum development, survivor support and peer mentorship.
